Corolla (including the spur) about 5 lin. long, sparingly pubescent; spur 21in. long, somewhat curved. Filaments of the longer stamens sparingly hairy, of the shorter glabrous. Style 1 lin. long, pubescent. Capsule li lin. long, globose-ovoid, minutely pubescent, shining, dehiscing by valvelike opercula. Seeds minutely tuberculate. Wile band. Nubia: about 21 North lat., sea-coast to between 3000 and 4000 ft., Bent! 4. li. nubica, Skan. A glandular-pubescent scandent or subscandent sparingly branched annual. Leaves opposite on the stem, alternate on the branches, 1--1J in. long, f-1 in. broad, sometimes much smaller, broadly cordate or obscurely triangular to ovate, quite entire or with a few obscure teeth, broad at the apex...
